

June 17th 2025 about noon at the State of Utah Attorney General Lobby.

1. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Hey, Mark. How are you?
2. **Mark Allen:** We need to talk, sir. K. Talk to you. I'm just turning, I'm just reporting criminal conduct of a—
3. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Judge. Okay.
4. **Mark Allen:** And your, your hands happened to, your fingerprints are not intentionally maybe on it, but that **GRAMA request** where you said we've got no records, the judge is trying to torch the records.
5. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Okay. We don't have any records like—
6. **Mark Allen:** Craig should. What? Craig Peterson should.
7. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** No. When the judge should expunge it, we expunged it.
8. **Mark Allen:** It's not expunged. Look up the docket. It's still open. We don't control the docket. Post dismissal, Craig Peterson asked for a hearing.
9. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Yeah. But we don't have records on that were expunged, right? You're asking for records that were expunged.
10. **Mark Allen:** No, I'm not. I'm asking for records that are still open in the **02/11 case**. There's 195 of them.
11. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** If the court has some, that's not our records. No, but—
12. **Mark Allen:** Correct. Peterson made an appearance May 1, post dismissal. He asked for a hearing with no jurisdiction, no standing. I was forced to appear. The judge started off the hearing, the transcript is right there for you to read. He started off the hearing and said, "I've got no jurisdiction." I said, "So then why are we here?" Shut his microphone off. I said, "You've got an administrative obligation to preserve records. I'm asking for that."
13. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** We don't. Once there's been an—
14. **Mark Allen:** Expungement, we're done. But there has not been an expungement.
15. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** We expunged them, Mark.
16. **Mark Allen:** No. You haven't. We, I checked. There, there are not records at—
17. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** This point.

18. **Mark Allen:** There are records. There's 195 of them. Where? The court docket **211**. The **09/20/2024**. I asked to stay the expungement. They stayed the expungement.
19. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** We had already expunged that.
20. **Mark Allen:** No, you tend to have expunged at that point. I'm not gonna talk to you about this. The prior case could have been—
21. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Litigate, litigate with us there, but— But what I'm doing, is that what I'm saying is not true? You're not hearing me? You don't care what I'm saying?
22. **Mark Allen:** No. I do care what you're saying. Then don't contradict me—
23. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** While I'm still standing here.
24. **Mark Allen:** It's not true. I checked. We had expunged all of—
25. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Our records. If anything happened after that point and after your request, that is a different case altogether.
26. **Mark Allen:** I never filed for an expungement request in that case.
27. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** No. But it was done by the court. And you did it in the court and the judge ordered us to do it. So we expunged it.
28. **Mark Allen:** No. It hasn't been expunged. It's court stock. It's still open. And then what can I—
29. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Do for you today? I told you I'm—
30. **Mark Allen:** Gonna, I'm just saying I'm reporting the, the, the judge's **corruption** right there. There, there, there's no immunity.
31. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Corruption implies that the judge has received some kind of payment. Oh. For action.
32. **Mark Allen:** Contract law violation.
33. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Okay. That is not corruption. That is just contract law.
34. **Mark Allen:** Contract law violation, administrative failure for—
35. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** The server. To a higher court?
36. **Mark Allen:** It's gone to the JCC. It's gone to every senator and every legislator. Court? I can't. Why not? It involves your guys' office and I'm trying to nip things in the

bud. Craig Peterson, you and Lonny Pehrson Pearson, represented there's no more records. The docket shows there's records. There's a transcript—

37. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Right there. The docket is not our records.
38. **Mark Allen:** Craig Peterson made an appearance with outstanding. Okay.
39. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** I feel like we're not hearing each other.
40. **Mark Allen:** No. We are hearing each other. Just go look it on your computer. I had—
41. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** To check after that date. We do not have records after that date. There's that is the docket though.
42. **Mark Allen:** That is a transcript. That—
43. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Is not—
44. **Mark Allen:** Our records. That is a transcript.
45. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Well, go to court and ask—
46. **Mark Allen:** Them for those records. I have, and, and, and I submitted filings, and the court clerk out of 84 pages that I submitted, 12 made it into the docket. Okay. They're pulling exhibits.
47. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Okay. So if you've talked to the court, why are you coming to me?
48. **Mark Allen:** Because you guys are supposed asked by Wendy Holleran about **prosecutorial misconduct** and he says we take it very, very seriously. And in fact, June 1, you've got a prosecutorial board that's being shown up. Prosecutorial board that's being shown up, and you're trying to get Lonny Pehrson Pearson appointed, and I've got material evidence of what he provided to you was false. I didn't go to Lonny Pehrson—
49. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** To confirm that the records at the next box.
50. **Mark Allen:** But the, the first email came from Lonny Pehrson that says there are no records.
51. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** The GRAMA officer. Yeah. So an attorney. Yeah. His job is to represent the office. And so I went and confirmed on my own outside of Lonny Pehrson that there were not records that they had been expunged.
52. **Mark Allen:** They, they did not.

53. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** How do you know that they've not? I mean, I confirmed this, Mark. I'm not, you're, you're telling me that something I did on my own didn't happen.
54. **Mark Allen:** Judge Brady messed up.
55. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Mark, do you need anything else? We're in—
56. **Mark Allen:** A little late, though. We need—
57. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** To cover. Go ahead. Okay. I'll call you later.
58. **Mark Allen:** Alright. Because the state admitted to **double jeopardy**, a, a duplicate exact process. They said we're going to consolidate directors. That didn't happen. Okay. It was spanning two judges.
59. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** My advice to you, get competent counsel and go litigate this in court.
60. **Mark Allen:** I'd rather, I'd rather solve it by gentlemanly—
61. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** You'd solve it by—
62. **Mark Allen:** Us. We have expunged your records. They shouldn't have been expunged because if they've been expunged—
63. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Then, and not have been. And that's not the same thing. Then that's spoilage. If they had—
64. **Mark Allen:** Been expunged and they shouldn't have been, take that to the court.
65. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** It's **15 10, 15 19, 6 6 6**. If they should have been expunged, take that to the court and prove and argue that. So who granted permission to expunge? I'm not gonna look at it, litigate this with you right now, Mark. No.
66. **Mark Allen:** I'm just asking a question. I'm not gonna litigate this to you right now. I'm not gonna litigate it. I'm just asking—
67. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** A question. And I'm telling you I'm not, not gonna respond to your question. We had expunged the records for the court's direction.
68. **Mark Allen:** So how did the court give direction for that? Because I don't have that record.
69. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Then you should ask the court for that record. They don't have one. I have sent you several emails which detailed how this happened. Yeah. You don't seem to take them seriously.

70. **Mark Allen:** No. I did. I sent you back the docket showing of all the records that are still in the case and the case is still open.
71. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** If you're in the docket, that is not our records. Correct. Or is it evidence of what's in our records?
72. **Mark Allen:** Craig Peterson has a record on his computer because he asked for a post dismissal hearing and he was carbon copied on that.
73. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** This was okay. Asking for a May, May 1. Well, asking for, I mean, I, I don't know how that proves your point.
74. **Mark Allen:** Well, he, he requested a record. The court scheduled it. They sent him back an email saying, "Here's May 1. You have to have a person." And you—
75. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Started a new GRAMA request to ask for that email? So what, so what, I mean,—
76. **Mark Allen:** Maybe I'll, I'll—
77. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Do that. You ask a GRAMA request months and months ago. I did. We respond to it. We're done with that issue. You come back and you say, "I have another thing that you didn't include." Well, that happened after those first two GRAMA requests or GRAMA requests.
78. **Mark Allen:** No. There were, there, there were about 15 records that should have showed up in that because the case hadn't been expunged. I'll send you a copy of the docket.
79. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Don't send me any more records. Litigate it in court. Take it to the judge. I don't—
80. **Mark Allen:** Wanna have to litigate it in court. It's cost me \$700,000 and made me homeless because of. But—
81. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** You're looking at something that we just don't see the same way you see it.
82. **Mark Allen:** Read, read this transcript of what the, the, the judge—
83. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Said. Transcript multiple times.
84. **Mark Allen:** No. This is a different one. This is, this is my first transcript. So go litigate this with the court. I'm, I'm, I'm asking you to, is there—
85. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** A court order there that I can follow? Yeah. There's a court order? Yeah. It sounds like you said a transcript.

86. **Mark Allen:** There's, there's if you scan the QR code and go to my case doc, you can see September 20 the judge said, "I will sign your order of dismissal."
87. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Did you give them the order of dismissal?
88. **Mark Allen:** I did and he said, "I won't sign it now." Why not? Because he didn't like that I attached a transcript of him admitting to diligence and competency violations.
89. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** So I can understand why he—
90. **Mark Allen:** Would do that. So I can too.
91. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Do the thing the judge asked, he will sign it. We won't. Do the thing that he didn't ask, he will not sign it.
92. **Mark Allen:** No. He, he said, "You prepared the order, I'll sign it." So I prepared the order and put a transcript to keep the record accurate, and his clerk made the mistake of saying he doesn't like your transcript. So I said, "Okay fine, give me a fee waiver and you create your own transcript so that we can have an accurate representation of the court record." He won't do that. So, they're, they're covering. They're giving—
93. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** A dispute with the court, not with us.
94. **Mark Allen:** No. Well, I've, I've got dispute with the, the GRAMA process has not been accurate because the case is still open. It's pending my motion for an expungement. If the—
95. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Case is still open, we shouldn't be responding to the GRAMA—
96. **Mark Allen:** Process at all. I've, the case has been, my case has been dismissed with prejudice but pending my motion to stay. The expungement certificate was not processed. So that's what is in the court docket. I hold the last card to say I want this cleaned up, but instead I have reached out through **GRAMA** to say, "I want this archived in the state archives in perpetuity. I'm not going to get it expunged." But if it's already expunged—
97. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** And already been done—
98. **Mark Allen:** It's not. It hasn't.
99. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** I don't know why you think that because I have confirmed that we don't have those records.
100. **Mark Allen:** I think—
101. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** You ought to double check. I did three times because you kept sending me emails about, Mark. Like, I didn't just do it one time. I

called up and I said, "Please confirm again and again and again. Are you sure?" I said, "They said, I'm, I'm positive."

102. **Mark Allen:** Who, who did you call? The, the record holders. So, and, and who, who are they? Is Stan here yet? Stan? Yeah. He's in there.
103. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** He's in there. I know. We have, we have a couple minutes. Yeah. I'll come get you when it can—
104. **Mark Allen:** Go. There's a, there's a lot of people that I don't know who to talk to because— But we're—
105. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Not here to be your guides.
106. **Mark Allen:** I'm not asking to be my guides, but if there is a records person that I'm supposed to talk to to confirm the records have been expunged, they don't have any. I would like to know who that is.
107. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** You keep leaving them off—
108. **Mark Allen:** Of your emails. Craig Peterson—
109. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** No. He's is the record holder. No. He, he is the perpetrator of the crime. He is the **record holder**. In state government, the person who creates the records is also the record holder.
110. **Mark Allen:** Okay. So when I do a GRAMA request and he doesn't provide anything and he is the record holder—
111. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Our database is to see if they have been expunged and they were confirmed to be expunged.
112. **Mark Allen:** Okay. Well then that's a **15 19 violation**. Great. Bring out a lawsuit then. You really want that?
113. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** I don't think you're accurate. I think we have a different termination of what happened in that court, and that's what's the crux. Okay.
114. **Mark Allen:** So just. We could believe the—
115. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Judge told us to expunge them. So we followed. And your request, by the way, it wasn't something we asked for. You asked for expunge them. The judge provided it. We executed it.
116. **Mark Allen:** So if later on you—
117. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Came back and said, "I don't wanna actually expunge it. I wanna preserve it."

118. **Mark Allen:** We expunged one of the two cases and we preserved the second one.
119. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Okay. Well, I don't know if that's—
120. **Mark Allen:** We preserved the second one because—
121. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** We have doubled the—
122. **Mark Allen:** Second one also? Yeah. That's the one that Craig's involved in.
123. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Okay. And so is it still ongoing?
124. **Mark Allen:** It's been dismissed, but the **expungement certificate**, I've, I've put a stay on that, and I'm trying to preserve the video records and the Zoom records of the initial screening, and everybody's playing hot potato.
125. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** So who has those Zoom records?
126. **Mark Allen:** Utah County is supposed to. Okay. That. And Zoom is supposed to, and Craig would have one for the, the last screening. If he justified three years of prosecuting me. He would have a history of the information filed, the screening filed, his notes, his emails,—
127. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** All that stuff. Assuming they weren't expunged.
128. **Mark Allen:** They weren't expunged. Assuming they weren't expunged. Okay. Okay. Let's assume that they weren't expunged. If they weren't expunged, where are the records?
129. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** If they were not expunged, they're still on the hard drives of our office. If they were expunged, they don't exist.
130. **Mark Allen:** If they were expunged, the I.T. Department can recover what's been deleted.
131. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** No, that's not how it works. If they're expunged, they don't exist anymore. I'm not gonna go back and call Microsoft and say, "Please bring these back." That's not how we operate. Right? We expunge them and delete them because you should be a free and clear man without something lingering out there.
132. **Mark Allen:** Well, I would agree, but that should have happened nine years ago. And because it didn't happen nine—
133. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Years ago, what David Levitt did.
134. **Mark Allen:** No. But I'm here to tell—

135. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** You that if we expunged, we don't preserve those, and we don't go back and find them again because you changed your mind or because you wanna use some for something else.
136. **Mark Allen:** I didn't change my mind.
137. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** I don't know what her reason was. I'm just saying if you had any reason to not want them expunged, once we're expunged, we expunged. That's it. It's over.
138. **Mark Allen:** But you need to have a judge's order to expunge. Right?
139. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Again, I don't know if I agree with you that we did or did not have a disorder. If you want to litigate that with us, please let me get that.
140. **Mark Allen:** Well, just do a GRAMA request to have you produce the document of the judge telling you to expunge it. Is that fair enough?
141. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** No. It's not because we don't hold those records. The judge does. That's not our records. You can send us a GRAMA request.
142. **Mark Allen:** Well, it's—
143. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** It's not—
144. **Mark Allen:** Our records. If you're basing on this whole argument that you've expunged stuff and you don't have a copy of the expungement order—
145. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** It would be on the docket, which you can go over. It's not—
146. **Mark Allen:** On the docket. Then litigate—
147. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** It. That's the, that's how the case, that's how our judicial works.
148. **Mark Allen:** That's, well, it, it doesn't because—
149. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** The judge want the Ivy's office. Alright. They want the Ivy's office for 36. So I'll grab our attorneys. I'll meet you up there in just two minutes. K. Holy. How do I get we, we have, like, all of our desks in the middle of the. Okay. How do I get to just take the stairs up, up right there on the left. Where? Not that, or the elevator to the—
150. **Mark Allen:** Fourth Floor. 436. Yeah. Let me, let me just put it this way as I leave. David Levitt handed off your office.
151. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** A stinker of a case.

152. **Mark Allen:** A stinker of a case. Yes. Cracked. And then that one we got, I had it transferred up here. Carl Hollan had integrity, and he said, "I gotta stand down." Craig had handed a stinker case. It took him three years to realize that it was a double jeopardy and he had no authority. But that's come at my expense. So I've tried to preserve the—
153. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Fair. And if, if Craig has anything, I'm glad to give you. I have no reason to withhold our records. I just don't think I have any.
154. **Mark Allen:** K. Well, just, just please, just—
155. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** I am glad to call them for the fourth time and find out. Mark, I have no reason to not give you our records. Like, they don't do any good for us.
156. **Mark Allen:** I'm trying, I'm trying to give you the benefit of the doubt because Lonny Pehrson thinks that we've got nothing and then you, you verified we've got nothing. I confirmed it. Yeah. So whoever's telling you that, needs a different job unless there really is nothing. There's a 195 records as of yesterday. In our, our database. In the state's database, and there's at least, several to Craig. Just ask Craig if he had an appearance May 1. He made that appearance.
157. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** If he had an appearance on May 1, that is long after your initial GRAMA request. Your GRAMA request goes back...
158. **Mark Allen:** No. I'm talking about the expungement. If there was an expungement, he had no lawful right to call the hearing and force me to appear.
159. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Do you continue to send records to the court and to us? I think he had every reason to show up and say, "Please, could you ask?"
160. **Mark Allen:** I'm, I'm asking, I'm, I'm asking to preserve the records. I'm asking for the judge to sign the order of dismiss it.
161. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** I've gotta go now.
162. **Mark Allen:** I'll let you go. Thanks for taking my time.
163. **Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office:** Again, like I said, I have no reason, no animus against you. I just want you to recognize it. If we've expunged it, we don't have it. I can't create it out of thin air. Well, I don't want it.
164. **Mark Allen:** If it's been deleted and the expungement hasn't been signed, then we got a problem. K. So thank you for your time. Now you know the whole story.
165. **Alicia Receptionist:** Thank you. Have a good afternoon. Thank you.

166. **Mark Allen:** Okay. So that was Attorney Daniel Burton AG's Office, the AG's office, and, unbelievable.

167. **Mark Allen:** Well, that was pretty darn interesting.
